- **Population: 3,730 million**
- **►**Territory: 69,700 sq.k.
- **➢ Semi-Presidential Unitary Democratic Republic**
- **▶** Capital: Tbilisi; Parliament sits in Kutaisi
- **Currency:** Georgian Lari (GEL) − 1 GEL = R 6 (Est.)
- ➤ Human Development Index: 79th (High)
- ➤GINI Index: 41.4 (Medium)

Georgia Today

- •Foreign Policy Priorities Multi-vector foreign policy driven by European and Euro-Atlantic aspirations; European Union Association Agreement with Deep and Comprehensive Free Trade agreement to be signed NATO Annual National Plan and NATO-GEORGIA Commission
- Liberal economy World Bank: Georgia Top Reformer
- Corruption free and secure country;
- Investment, Business and trade opportunities in Agriculture, Hydro Power, Manufacturing, Logistics Hub, Tourism, other;
- Strategic Location on Historic Silk Road on the Crossroads of the East and West, North and South



Georgia-South Africa

- 1993 Diplomatic relations established
- **2011** Embassy opened; **2012** First Ambassador arrived
- <u>FOCUS</u>: forging partnership across all possible areas from political dialogue to economic relations/business to arts and culture
- September 2013 First South Africa-Georgia High Level Political Consultations between Foreign Ministries in Pretoria
- November 2012 Memorandum of Cooperation in Paleo-Sciences signed between the Wits and Georgian National Museum
- May 2013 Tbilisi State University signs Memoranda of Cooperation with Pretoria University and the Wits University
- January 2014 South Africa-Georgia Chamber of Commerce (SAGCC)
 established (45 companies with SA component registered in Georgia
 focused on agriculture, real estate, financial sector, tourism, consulting)
- February 2014 Memorandum of Cooperation signed between National Library of South Africa and National Parliamentary Library of Georgia – Georgian book collection established at NLSA, Pretoria

forging partnerships in Africa

- Three Georgian Embassies on the continent: Cairo, Addis Ababa, Pretoria
- Embassy in Pretoria also accredited to:
 Mauritius, Madagascar, Mozambique, Zambia, Zimbabwe, Botswana,
 Democratic Republic of Congo, Lesotho (pending)

Georgia for AFRICA

- reliable and friendly partner
- gateway to Caucasus, to Black Sea and Caspian Sea Regions and Eurasia;
- Potential in political dialogue, cooperation on multilateral *fora*, trade, education and culture, experience sharing in reforms and transformation

Georgia Reforms

Since 2003-Ongoing


- > Reforms Comprehensive, all-encompassing, speedy:
- <u>Democratic Reforms:</u> Media Freedom, free and fair elections, protection of human rights and minority rights, check & balances, open and participatory democracy
- Rule of Law Reforms: Police, Judiciary, Criminal Justice, Prison, Anti-corruption, organized crime, public Services
- <u>Economic Reforms:</u> Free market economy, business-friendly environment, financial intermediation, infrastructure, energy security and efficiency, tourism development
- <u>Human Development Reforms:</u> Education, health care, social assistance, cultural development, sport development, environmental protection
- ➤ "Since 2003, Georgia has implemented an impressive array of reforms... the reforms can be qualified as unique in terms of speed of reforms, degree of innovations, and extent of institutional restructuring"

Police/Traffic Police Reform

- → "The Police Reforms in particular were one of the first, and most effectively targeted" UNDP, Human Development Report, 2008
- ➤ Confidence in police: 83% in 2014, compared to 10% in 2003 Int. Rep. Institute
- ➤ "More than 95% Georgians feel safe during day time and night" EU funded Georgian Crime Survey, GORBI Institute
- ➤ Transparency International Global Corruption Barometer 2013 Question: "To what extent do you perceive the police to be effected by corruption", [1 not at all corrupt; 5 extremely corrupt]
- -Finland 1.8
- -Georgia 2.5
- -Germany 2.7
- -France 3.3
- -UK 3.0
- -Russia 4.5
- >80% reduction in armed robberies from 2006-2010
